



As a reformer, I believe the office of the Commonwealth's Attorney should be impartial because impartiality leads to transparency, which leads to community trust, which leads to public safety for all, including law enforcement officers on the job. Voters have told me time and again that they want a Commonwealth's Attorney they can trust to be impartial and hold everyone accountable, and 72% of Virginians say they want these criminal justice reforms.

One of the many ways Arlington and the City of Falls Church are lagging behind on criminal justice reform is the lack of an independent review in instances of use of force. Neighboring counties use the State Police, an independent prosecutor, or even a community review board. We don't.

Once elected to office my goal is to bring all stakeholders together, including the County Board, the Police Department, and community leaders to come up with a common sense solution for independent and impartial review that will foster transparency, community trust, and public safety.
